
## Blaenau Gwent Wildlife Site/SINC Notification Form

## SITE SUMMARY



## FULL DESCRIPTION OF SITE (including topography, adjacent land use, access and boundaries etc.):

An extensive rock and scree covered south-west facing slope with dry acidic grassland situated south of the centre of Tredegar adjacent to the Coed-y-Rhyd forest. The site is enclosed by stone walls and grazed by sheep which have unrestricted access. The grassland occurs above the hamlet of Troedrhiwgwair. The community is characteristic of (U4) with *Anthoxanthum odoratum* (Sweet Vernal-grass), *Agrostis capillaris* (Common bent), *Potentilla erecta* (Tormentil), *Galium saxatile* (Heath bedstraw), *Vaccinium myrtillus* (Bilberry), *Nardus stricta* (Mat-grass), *Deschampsia flexuosa* (Wavy hair-grass) and *Rumex acetosella* (Sheeps's sorrel) and localised parched areas *containing Festuca ovina* (Sheep's-fescue), *Aira praecox* (Early hair-grass), *Pilosella officinarium* (Mouse-ear hawkweed) with lichens and mosses.
