An old viaduct crosses over the site, linking the valley sides. Below the viaduct and to its north west a further patch of marshy grassland includes <i>Lathyrus pratensis</i> (Meadow vetchling), <i>Achillea ptarmica</i> (Sneezewort), <i>Juncus</i> (Rush) <i>spp</i> and <i>Angelica sylvestris</i> (Wild angelica). This is fenced off from an otherwise improved field.				
A further field to the east of the river (cut at time of survey in 2005) was revisited in 2006. The field supports a mosaic of marshy and neutral grassland dominated by rushes and tall grasses. A reasonable though localised herb diversity is present. The site is bordered by a mixture of land use including houses, cemetery, bracken (<i>Pteridium aquilinum</i>), woodland and to the south enclosed damp neutral grassland managed for hay (though not of sufficient diversity to justify cWS).
