Summary description

A horse-grazed field with semi-improved neutral grassland and Bracken. The grassland species include Harebell, Common bird's-foot trefoil, Yellow rattle and Eyebright. A dense hedge of recently planted Hawthorn, Ash and Oak runs along the northwestern boundary.

Qualifying features

Semi-improved neutral grassland with at least 8 indicator species.

Secondary features

Hedge.

Bracken.

Potential value/ unconfirmed features

The site could potentially support grassland fungi.

Current management (including problems and opportunities for biodiversity enhancement)

The fields appear to be intermittently grazed by horses, which is probably the optimal management for this type of grassland. Bracken control may be beneficial for biodiversity.

Access/ community use

There is no public access to the field, although public roads border three of the margins.

Additional information

The site appears to have been ungrazed for several months, with horses reintroduced shortly before the survey. Nearby horse-grazed fields at SO171012 and SO173011 (viewed from the road) also supported *Centaurea nigra, Campanula rotundifolia, Lotus corniculatus, Leontodon hispidus* and *Ranunculus acris*, and appeared potentially suitable for grassland fungi. Further survey may confirm that these nearby fields meet SINC criteria and should be included at future review.


