Summary description

An area of former coal workings now supporting horse-grazed pasture. There is a mix of acid grassland, damp semi-improved neutral grassland, Bracken and scattered Hawthorn scrub. Species occurring in the acid grassland area include Bilberry, Sheep's fescue, Wavy hair-grass and Tormentil. The damp semi-improved neutral grassland includes Great burnet, Betony, Purple moor-grass and locally abundant rushes.

Qualifying features

Semi-improved neutral grassland with at least 8 indicator species.

Acid grassland / heath with at least 7 indicator species.

Secondary features

Temporary ponds.

Bracken.

Scrub.

Potential value/ unconfirmed features

The drier grassland areas have potential to support waxcap fungi.

The scrub and Bracken margins and tussocky grassland areas are likely to support reptiles.

Current management (including problems and opportunities for biodiversity enhancement)

Horses graze the whole area and a few parts appear to have been agriculturally improved. The area is subject to local disturbance and tipping from the adjoining houses. Local Bracken control would also be beneficial for biodiversity. Japanese knotweed is present along some parts of the northwestern boundary. The removal of refuse and tipped materials from depressions in the southern part of site (possibly former bell-pit workings) and re-lining them to form ponds would enhance the biodiversity of the site.

Access/ community use

A public footpath crosses the site, but there are signs of informal access across the whole area.

Additional information

The aerial photograph suggests that there is other habitat nearby that is also of potential value for nature conservation. In particular, the damp grassland at SO165010 and acid grassland on coal spoil at SO162007. These areas should be considered at future review.


