Summary description

Small woodland with a canopy of mature Alder, Sessile Oak and Hazel. There is a mainly grassy ground flora with little under storey and no regeneration of young trees. However, semi-natural ground flora indicator species occur at a low density throughout the area. There are several areas of damp ground and a small stream channel that was almost dry during the survey.

Qualifying features

Semi-natural woodland with an assemblage of indicator species.

Secondary features

Hedges.

Potential value/ unconfirmed features

The woodland habitat has potential to provide feeding and roosting habitats for bats.

Current management (including problems and opportunities for biodiversity enhancement)

The site is grazed by sheep, which has resulted in a limited diversity of ground flora species, with grasses being favoured. A reduction or cessation of this grazing would enhance the biodiversity of the site. There are a few signs of vandalism (fires) and litter, but not to an extent that would affect the nature conservation status of the site.

Access/ community use

There is no formal public access to the site, but there is evidence of informal use for activities such as dog walking.



Woodland / scrub canopy and shrub species: Alnus glutinosa, Fraxinus excelsior, Quercus petraea, Corylus avellana, Fagus sylvatica, Salix caprea, Malus sp., Ilex aquifolium, Quercus robur, Crataegus monogyna, Rubus fruticosus, Prunus spinosa, Sambucus nigra, Acer pseudoplatanus.

Woodland ground flora species: **Hyacinthoides non-scripta**, Ranunculus ficaria, Circaea lutetiana, Holcus mollis, Lysimachia nemorum, Digitalis purpurea, Conopodium majus, Potentilla erecta, Anthoxanthum odoratum, Oxalis acetosella, Agrostis capillaris, Deschampsia cespitosa, Glyceria fluitans, Juncus effusus, Carex remota, Athyrium filix-femina, Mnium hornum, Kindbergia praelonga, Polytrichum cf formosum, Atrichum undulatum.

Fauna observations: Great Tit, Blackbird, Chaffinch, Wren, Blue Tit, Blackcap, Robin.

Additional species noted from desk study: Several **bat** records from nearby houses.



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
