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FULL DESCRIPTION OF SITE (including topography, adjacent land use, access and boundaries etc.):						
The site comprises two steep fields (upper and lower) above and to the side of Hillside House, an area						
divided off for pigs, two other more level fields adjacent to Pen-y-fan Green, plus woodland areas between these fields and those near the house.						
between these neids and those near the nouse.						
There is much bracken invasion in the fields near the house. It is extensive in the upper field and occurs						
in broad swathes at either side in the lower field. A relatively small area of grassland is free of bracken but this field (despite a lack of grazing over recent years and some mulching when grass has been cut						
and left in situ) is still very rich in plants.						
One of the fields by Pen-y-fan Green has a steep bracken bank, but these fields are otherwise clear of						
bracken. They grade to the north and east into a strip of woodland with some fine oaks, sycamore, cherry, hazel, holly and rowan and a ground layer of native bluebells. Old sunken tracks, an old well						
and exposed rocks add to the interest. Ferns were prolific – Male Fern, Lady Fern, Broad Buckler Fern						
and Harts Tongue Fern – in the woodland but also in a ditch-like depression between the two fields near the house. Foxgloves were quite frequent at the edges of the fields and woodland.
