FULL DESCRIPTION OF SITE (including topography, adjacent land use, access and boundaries etc.):

A sheep grazed (sheep excluded July when apples start to fall) orchard with a grassy floor. It is surrounded by overgrown, mature hedgerows. A further orchard area lies immediately to the north. The field is slightly undulating but generally slopes gently downwards to the south-east. The orchard contains many varieties of Apples and Pears of considerable age with many veteran tree features but most trees are still highly productive. The south-west side was planted in 1920 (approximately 100 years old) and the rest is thought to be as much as 150-200 years old. Mistletoe was abundant through the orchard but was cut back a lot last year as it was so dense it was affecting the health of the trees. The variety of tree shapes and the fact that the trees did not appear to be in regimented rows gave the orchard a very "natural" feel. In addition to the many veteran trees approximately 90 newer trees have also been planted (10 a year for the last 9 years). Many of these are grafts from the original orchard trees. Birds and butterflies were plentiful within the orchard although the owner said butterfly numbers were lower than usual. Dead wood was generally left in the orchard but was sometimes moved to allow the planting of new trees.




