The site is bordered by a wooden fence along the southern boundary and a hedge along the northern boundary. The grass is improved but a small stream that flows through the site provides some additional ecological interest and is flanked by rushes with Water Mint, Fools Watercress and Watercress present within it. The orchard only occupies the northern end of the field and comprises a mix of Pear, Apple and Plum. There is a mix of older trees (C. 50 years) and younger planting. A number of the apple trees have died in the last year (these were particularly festooned in Mistletoe). None of the trees are veteran so veteran features are quite scarce and fallen dead wood has been removed.
