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FULL DESCRIPTION OF SITE (including topography, adjacent land use, access and boundaries etc.):

This site is basically the churchyard of St. Michaels and All Angels Church. The churchyard is grassland which graves distributed throughout. The site is surrounded by a selection of shrubs & trees and there is an area of Species-rich Grassland immediately to the north of the churchyard.

The grass is generally cut quite regularly but had not been up to mid-May in 2017. The grassland was flowery with Ox-eye Daisy (*Leucanthemum vulgare*) and Bulbous Buttercup (*Ranunculus bulbosus*) being particularly abundant and noticeable, together with noticeable amounts of Bugle (*Ajuga reptans*) within quite a diverse sward. The grass species are generally finer species with Sweet Vernal Grass (*Anthoxanthum odoratum*) being particularly abundant and Field Wood-rush (*Luzula campestris*) is frequent throughout. The herbs are generally well distributed throughout the site but are less abundant in the shade of the occasional trees that is scattered throughout the graveyard. The grassland is also less species-rich in the shade to the north of the church.

The presence of the invasive alien species (Himalayan Balsam (*Impatiens glandulifera*) at the northern edge and Three-cornered Leek (*Allium triquetrum*) to the east of the church) should be noted.


