The grassland is quite diverse with good scattering of indicator species throughout including <i>Rhinathus minor</i> , <i>Viccia cracca</i> and <i>Centaurea nigra</i> with 2 <i>Dactylorhiza fuchsii</i> spikes located in the northern corder. The grassland is quite dry and flat and is surrounded by a recently coppiced/cut back hedge. The site lies adjacent to the village green at Pentwyn and is surrounded by roads on all other sides. The area of grassland is mown around the edges to keep the <i>Pteridium aquilinum</i> down. Site has been in family for 60+ years and the family house is located to the east of the grassland which opens cut into the garden with no fence. | H4 Neutral Grasslands |
