These areas (1 and 2) are relatively flat/gradually sloping to the south-east. There were several mature yew trees. The graveyard areas were bordered by stone walls and fencing. The adjacent meadow area (3) was species-poor although it comprised a sward of fine grasses, abundant red fescue and sweet vernal grass, frequent field woodrush and locally frequent yarrow, pignut and lesser hawkbit.
