It is surrounded by hedgerows on all sides with those on the eastern and western sides being quite species rich. An existing grassland LWS with the same ownership lies immediately adjacent to the south-west, the gardens of "Highbrow" to the south and a road to the east/north. The field is generally quite flowery with finer grass species. Yellow Rattle (<i>Rhinanthus minor</i>) is abundant in much of the field and other indicator species such as Birdsfoot Trefoil (<i>Lotus corniculatus</i>), Red Clover (<i>Trifolium pratense</i>), Ox-eye Daisy (<i>Leucanthemum vulgare</i>) and Rough Hawkbit (<i>Leontodon hispidus</i>) are well distributed and generally of frequent abundance. The field has a slight calcareous feel to it with Wild Basil (<i>Clinopodium vulgare</i>), Hedge Bedstraw (<i>Galium mollugo</i>) of local distribution together with a number of species that are indicators of good quality for both calcareous and neutral grassland.
