29	Camlas Morgannwg/ Glamorganshire Canal (Glamorganshire Canal Woodlands)	Ancient semi-natural woodlands on the valley sides adjacent to the course of the former Glamorganshire Canal, which now forms part of the Taff Trail. Some of the woodlands have ground flora with numerous ancient woodland indicator species. Two long-established pastures supporting acid grassland are present in the south of the site. Also includes small areas of semi-improved neutral grassland, bracken patches and scrub, as well as ditches, streams and a wooded pond. The site is important for a range of woodland birds.
