

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SITE OF IMPORTANCE FOR NATURE CONSERVATION

BRUNEL DOCK GRASSLAND

Site Description:

A linear area of relatively species rich neutral grassland which supports uncommon species including Wild liquorice. The grassland runs alongside the old dock at Britton Ferry, under the M4 fly-over to the Civic Amenity site. The grassland is partially natural, and partly seeded with wild flower seed as part of the landscaping scheme for the Local Authority Office building, The Quays, Baglan Energy Park. The grassland runs down to the estuary where saltmarsh communities containing Rock Sea Lavender and other significant saltmarsh plants. A small area of Reedbed (SINC Ref 0041) occupies the old dock basin which is adjacent to the grassland. A small swale area within The Quays is included due to the presence of Long-winged conehead.
