

Site Description:

A large flat expanse of marshy grassland, lying north of the A465 adjacent to Neath Abbey. The site is bisected E-W by Neath Canal. The north side is now almost completely reedbed. Although the site has not been surveyed, from aerial images the following habitats have been identified: Rush Pasture, Purple Moor Grass, broadleaved woodland and scrub, canal.
