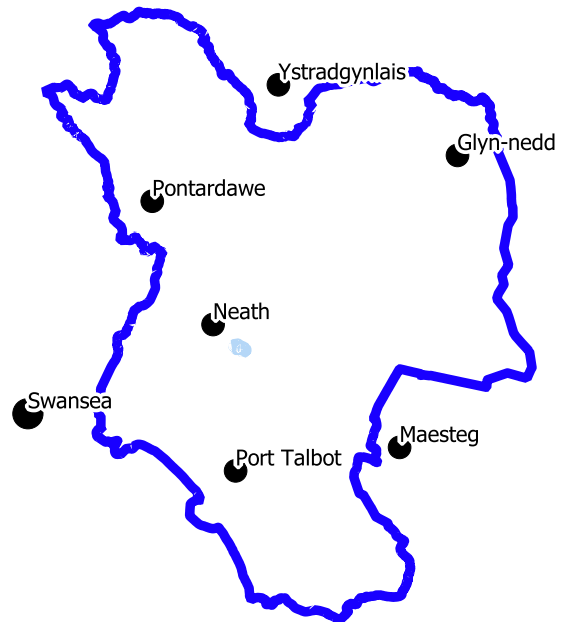

Site Description:

Native coniferous woodland (W10) including Beech, Cherry laurel, Downy birch, Hawthorn, Hazel, Holly, Hornbeam, Pedunculate oak and Rowan. The understory includes Yellow pimpernel, Honeysuckle, Hard fern, Pendulous sedge and Scaly male fern with >25% carpet of Bluebell. There is an unmodified stream running through.
