Description:

This site is one of the most extensive areas of agriculturally unimproved lowland grassland remaining in Brecknock. It comprises four fields situated on level ground to the west of Llangorse Lake. A wide range of typical grassland plants is present, including a species that is rare in Mid-Wales.

The majority of the site supports a sward dominated by common bent Agrostis capillaris, sweet vernal-grass Anthoxanthum odoratum, crested dogs-tail Cynosurus cristatus, red fescue Festuca rubra and Yorkshire-fog Holcus lanatus, with frequent common knapweed Centaurea nigra, common birds-foot-trefoil Lotus corniculatus, ribwort plantain Plantago lanceolata, tormentil Potentilla erecta, devils-bit scabious Succisa pratensis and red clover Trifolium pratense. Other characteristic associates include heath grass Danthonia decumbens, autumn hawkbit Leontodon autumnalis and betony Stachys officinalis. Glaucus sedge Carex flacca is locally abundant and species such as meadow fescue Festuca pratensis and hairy ladies-mantle Alchemilla filicaulis are occasional in the sward.

The wetter parts of the fields are either dominated by rushes *Juncus* spp. or by purple moor-grass *Molinia caerulea*. The former community is characterised by abundant sharp-flowered rush *Juncus acutiflorus* with frequent meadowsweet *Filipendula ulmaria*, common marsh-bedstraw *Galium palustre* and greater birds-foot-trefoil *Lotus uliginosus*, and also occasional marsh valerian *Valeriana dioica*. The latter community shows affinities with the drier grassland, but also supports species such as tawny sedge *Carex hostiana*, heath spotted-orchid *Dactylorhiza maculata* subsp. *ericetorum* and the regionally rare pepper-saxifrage *Silaum silaus*. A small area of woodland on the western edge of the site is dominated by alder *Alnus glutinosa* and ash *Fraxinus excelsior*.

Remarks:

The site lies within the Brecon Beacons National Park.

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
