## **Description:**

This site is a good example of a type of upland, species-rich hay-meadow that is now rare and restricted to a few localities in mid-Wales. It lies adjacent to the headwaters of the River Elan at over 350 metres (1000 feet) above sea level.

The majority of the sward is dominated by grasses such as the common bent Agrostis capillaris, sweet vernal-grass Anthoxanthum odoratum, crested dogs-tail Cynosurus cristatus and Yorkshire fog Holcus lanatus. Frequent associates include common knapweed Centaurea nigra, tormentil Potentilla erecta, yellow rattle Rhinanthus minor, devils-bit scabious Succisa pratensis and red clover Trifolium pratense. Pignut Conopodium majus, heath-grass Danthonia decumbens, bluebell Hyacinthoides non-scriptus and great burnet Sanguisorba officinalis are locally prominent within this community. Drier banks support a shorter sward dominated by bents Agrostis spp., sweet vernal-grass and sheeps fescue Festuca ovina. Characteristic associates here include harebell Campanula rotundifolia, eyebright Euphrasia officinalis, heath bedstraw Galium saxatile, betony Stachys officinalis, mountain pansy Viola lutea and the uncommon greater butterfly-orchid Platanthera chloranther. Additional variety to the site is provided by wet hollows supporting spieces such as marsh-marigold Caltha palustris, sharp-flowered rush Juncus acutiflorus, greater birds-foot-trefoil Lotus uliginosis and marsh violet Viola palustris.
