Site Area: 5.1 ha

Description:

This site comprises an extensive and varied area of damp/wet heathy pasture above the valley of the River Giedd, near Ystradgynlais. It is noted for its wide variety of plant species, including several that are uncommon in Brecknock.

A large part of the site supports a sward dominated by purple moor-grass Molinia caerulea, sedges Carex spp. and common cottongrass Eriophorum angustifolium. Sharpflowered rush Juncus acutiflorus is locally prominent and meadow thistle Cirsium dissectum is common throughout this plant community. A wide range of associated species are present, including quaking-grass Briza media, heather Calluna vulgaris, whorled caraway Carum verticillatum, cross-leaved heath Erica tetralix, marsh pennywort Hydrocotyle vulgaris, bog asphodel Narthecium ossifragum, lesser skullcap Scutellaria minor, devil's-bit scabious Succisa pratensis, saw-wort Serratula tinctoria, globeflower Troillius europaeus and a large colony of marsh helleborine Epipactis palustris, an orchid that is rare in this part of Wales. There are extensive areas of flush associated with this community. These are dominated by small sedges (star sedge Carex echinata, glaucous sedge C. flacca, tawny sedge C. hostiana, carnation sedge C. panicea and flea sedge C. pulicaris). Other species include quaking-grass, bog pimpernel Anagallis tenella, round-leaved sundew Drosera rotundifolia, eyebright Euphrasia agg., few-flowered spike-rush Eleocharis quinqueflora, bulbous rush Juncus bulbosus, marsh lousewort Pedicularis palustris, common butter-wort Pinguicula vulgaris, devil's-bit scabious and marsh arrowgrass Triglochin palustris.

The western part of the site is dominated by soft rush *Juncus effusus*. Associates here include Yorkshire-fog *Holcus lanatus*, sedges, whorled caraway, common spike-rush *Eleocharis palustris*, meadowsweet *Filipendula ulmaria*, common marsh-bedstraw *Galium palustre*, greater bird's-foot-trefoil *Lotus uliginosus* and ragged-robin *Lychnis flos-cuculi*. There are also small patches of drier grassland characterised by an abundance of purple moor-grass, sweet vernal-grass *Anthoxanthum odoratum* and bents

Agrostis spp.. Additional interest is provided by stands of alder Alnus glutinosa and by ditches which support species such as hemp-agrimony Eupatorium cannabinum, bogbean Menyanthes trifoliata, bog pondweed Potamogeton polygonifolius and the locally uncommon fern Osmunda regalis.
