## **Description:**

This unimproved meadow located 4 miles to the north of Raglan slopes gently to the north and is crossed by a stream. Soils are clayey brown earths of the Bromyard Association which have developed on the underlying alluvium and Raglan Marsh sandstone. There is some seasonal waterlogging.

Lower Ground supports a neutral unimproved grassland community and an unimproved mire community.

The drier areas support extensive areas of the *Danthonia decumbens* sub-community of the *Centaurea nigra – Cynosurus cristatus* mesotrophic grassland type. The most common grasses are sweet vernal-grass *Anthoxanthum odoratum*, heath-grass *Danthonia decumbens* and crested dog's-tail *Cynosurus cristatus*. Herbs include common knapweed *Centaurea nigra*, betony *Stachys officinalis* and dyer's greenweed *Genista tinctoria*.

The wetter areas of the site bordering the stream support the *Juncus acutiflorus* sub-community of the *Juncus effusus/acutiflorus* — *Galium palustre* mire type. Sharp-flowered rush *Juncus acutiflorus* dominates with a variety of grasses which include Yorkshire-fog *Holcus lanatus*, purple moor-grass *Molinia caerulea* and rough meadow-grass *Poa trivialis*. Marsh marigold *Caltha palustris*, marsh thistle *Cirsium palustre* and marsh pennywort *Hydrocotyle vulgaris* are also present.

The site supports a number of locally rare species including petty whin *Genista anglica*, southern marshorchid *Dactylorhiza praetermissa* and flea sedge *Carex pulicaris*.

Additional diversity is provided by small areas of alder carr, dense and scattered scrub, dense bracken and bank-side vegetation.

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
