Description:

This site is an excellent example in Montgomery of unimproved acid wet pasture on a peaty substrate. It is unusually species-rich for its type and includes a number of locally uncommon species. It consists of two south-facing fairly steeply sloping fields separated by a narrow wooded gulley. The land is used as rough grazing for sheep and cattle.

The grassland is predominantly of fescues, bent and sweet vernal-grass (Festuca/Agrostis/Anthoxanthum odoratum), but with a heathy component in which purple moor-grass Molinia caerulea and mat-grass Nardus stricta are represented, together with small quantities of bilberry Vaccinium myrtillus and cross-leaved heath Erica tetralix. Petty whin Genista anglica is frequent and there are local occurrences of bog pimpernel Anagallis tenella.

A tall-herb component of the site is represented by a series of rush-dominated flushes *Juncus acutiformis/articulatus* in which meadowsweet *Filipendula ulmaria*, common valerian *Valeriana officinalis* and marsh-marigold *Caltha palustris* occur. A flush at the eastern end of the site is particularly well developed, with the presence of the uncommon globeflower *Trollius europaeus* being a particularly noteworthy feature.
